1	<b>Visual Arts - Observation and Creation</b> , focuses on developing observational skills and fundamental visual expression through Photography, emphasizing basic composition, and Painting, introducing core techniques and color theory, assessed through a portfolio of student work.	25%





2	<b>Decorative Arts and Craft - Culture and Skill</b> , delves into cultural art forms with Rangoli, exploring design principles and cultural context, and Handicraft, where students learn basic techniques with a chosen material, evaluated through the created items.	25%
3	<b>Performing Arts - Expression and Communication</b> , aims to enhance communication through voice and movement, featuring Anchoring, concentrating on verbal and non-verbal skills, and Folk Dance, emphasizing basic steps and cultural relevance, assessed through performances. Finally,	25%
4	<b>Narrative and Storytelling - Enactment and Visuals</b> , develops narrative skills through performance in Drama, involving basic acting and scene work, and basic visual storytelling in Film Making, focusing on short video concepts, with assessment based on participation and project completion. The overarching assessment emphasizes practical engagement and active participation across all activities.	25%

2	<p><b>Painting and it's Techniques:</b></p> <p>Painting activities provide students with a valuable opportunity to explore their creativity, express emotions, and develop artistic techniques in a relaxed and engaging environment. Whether through guided workshops, collaborative mural projects, or themed painting sessions like "Paint and Sip" or "Art for a Cause," these activities help students improve their understanding of color theory, composition, and visual storytelling. Painting also serves as a therapeutic outlet, reducing stress and encouraging mindfulness. Students will learn and practice basic painting techniques.</p>
3	<p><b>Handicraft:</b></p> <p>Handicraft activities allow students to explore their creativity through hands-on projects like paper art, jewelry making, embroidery, or recycled crafts. These activities encourage patience, attention to detail, and innovative thinking. They promote sustainability, cultural appreciation, and can foster a strong sense of accomplishment and community.</p>
4	<p><b>Anchoring - Voice and Delivery:</b></p> <p>Anchoring activities help students build confidence, improve public speaking skills, and enhance stage presence. Whether hosting events, moderating discussions, or leading cultural programs, anchoring fosters clear communication, quick thinking, and audience engagement. It also encourages teamwork and helps students develop a professional and charismatic demeanor.</p>





5	<p><b>Drama or Theater:</b></p> <p>Drama or theater activities allow students to explore storytelling, emotion, and expression through performance. Involvement in acting, scriptwriting, or stage production builds confidence, teamwork, and creative thinking. These activities also enhance communication skills and empathy, as students step into different characters and perspectives. Theater fosters a strong sense of collaboration and offers a powerful outlet for artistic and personal growth.</p>
6	<p><b>Folk Dance - Basic Steps and Rhythm:</b></p> <p>Folk dance activities allow students to celebrate cultural heritage while promoting physical fitness and teamwork. By learning traditional dance forms from various regions, students gain a deeper appreciation for diversity and cultural expression. These activities foster coordination, rhythm, and group harmony.</p>
7	<p><b>Beauty and Grooming:</b></p> <p>Beauty and grooming activities help students enhance their personal care routines while building confidence and self-expression. Through workshops on skincare, makeup, hairstyling, and grooming tips, students learn practical skills that promote hygiene, professionalism, and self-presentation. These sessions also encourage creativity and can inspire interest in fashion, wellness, or cosmetology fields.</p>
8	<p><b>Rangoli Making:</b></p> <p>Rangoli making activities allow students to express creativity through intricate designs made with colored powders, flowers, or other materials. Rooted in cultural tradition, rangoli promotes artistic skills, patience, and attention to detail. These activities also encourage teamwork and cultural appreciation, often bringing students together during festivals and special events to celebrate unity and tradition through art.</p>
9	<p><b>Basic Acting Techniques &amp; Scene Work:</b></p> <p>Basic Acting Techniques and Scene Work activities help students develop foundational performance skills such as voice modulation, body language, emotional expression, and character building. Through exercises, improvisation, and scripted scene practice, students learn to connect with their roles and collaborate effectively with others. These activities enhance confidence, creativity, and communication, providing a strong base for both stage and screen acting.</p>



10	<b>Filmmaking - Shot Composition &amp; Angles:</b>  Filmmaking activities focused on Shot Composition and Angles teach students how to visually tell a story by carefully framing each shot and choosing the right camera angles. Students learn techniques like the rule of thirds, leading lines, and perspective to create mood, focus attention, and enhance narrative impact. Practicing these skills helps improve creativity, technical understanding, and the ability to communicate ideas effectively through film.
11	<b>Creative Content Writing:</b>  Creative Content Writing activities encourage students to develop their imagination and writing skills by crafting original stories, poems, scripts, or articles. These exercises help students explore different styles, voices, and formats while enhancing their ability to engage readers and convey ideas clearly. Through feedback and collaboration, students build confidence, critical thinking, and effective communication—essential skills for both academic and professional success. Students will plan and shoot a short visual narrative sequence.
12	<b>Music:</b>  Music activities for students provide a dynamic way to explore creativity, improve technical skills, and foster teamwork. Whether through singing, instrument practice, songwriting, or group performances, these activities enhance musical understanding and expression. Participating in music also boosts confidence, emotional well-being, and cultural appreciation, creating a vibrant and supportive community on campus.
